From the Highway Commissioner

Dear Residents,

As always, I hope this letter finds you and your family well.

Again, another challenging Year. I am sure we can all agree that this past year has been another challenging one. And, like most government agencies and businesses, the Road District has had its share of challenges too.

As you know the County delayed second installment real estate tax bills until November this year. That is a delay of payments for five (5) months. What this really means for the Road District is leaves the Road District again to stretch our already thin reserve funds even thinner. The bulk of our funding comes from Real Estate taxes. Most years we receive funds beginning in April and in August. This year we had to stretch from the April's bill until December. Despite these setbacks the Road District was able to repave Linneman Street in Glenview and purchase a much-needed plow truck (affectionately called Big Red). The Road District purchased this truck used from another Township Road District. In my opinion our Road District got an amazing deal in a time when new and used trucks are hard to come by. Big Red replaces a 20-year-old truck (number 8).

The Road District's Unique Role. I often hear misconceptions about the services and operations of the Road District and I would like to explain the unique role the Township has in the community. Unlike the State of Illinois, Cook County, or municipalities, the Northfield Township Road District relies solely on capped real estate taxes as its only source of funds. For example, a typical home valued at \$400,000, both the incorporated and unincorporated home owner pays the Road District approximately \$66.00 per year. Half of the incorporated home owner's, \$66.00 (\$33.00) goes back to the Villages for its Road projects. These remaining monies are applied toward the following tasks in areas of the Northfield Township Road District, which serves over 86,800 residents in unincorporated Northfield, Northbrook, Glenview, Prospect Heights, Deerfield, Wilmette, Glencoe, and Des Plaines.

- Maintaining and resurfacing the unincorporated roads that are not controlled by a municipality, Cook County, or the state of Illinois
- Replacing deficient storm sewers and maintaining storm sewer system
- Maintaining emergency storm services, public streets, sidewalks, street lighting, and signs
- Operating a cutting-edge Recycling Center that provides extensive free document shredding, electronics, paint, oil, tire, fluorescent light bulb and chemical recycling.
- Managing a reforestation program that shares the cost of planting new parkway trees and trimming trees and bushes on the right-of-way in the unincorporated areas.

When you consider the comprehensive services provided, the Northfield Township Road District is an exceptional value to the taxpayers of the Township.

I have been honored to be your Highway Commissioner, and I'm focused on the following goals:

- Continuing to provide funding for resident programs such as recycling, flooding, road repairs, plowing, tree trimming, and on-going street maintenance.
- Continue to develop a township wide comprehensive recycling program for all the villages the Road District services. Our objective is to create a homogeneous community recycling center, efficiently funneling all recycling into one centralized location.
- Provide the Township's residents with excellent service by adapting to our ever changing environment, succeeding with effective planning and teamwork, and successfully responding to emergency situations.

Strong Teamwork. I feel fortunate not only to be your Highway Commissioner but also blessed to have a great staff at the Road District. My team and I share a common goal

- to provide the Township's residents with excellent service, 24/7, and to let our good work and deeds speak for themselves. Our staff continues to adapt to our ever-changing environment, succeeding with effective planning, especially during emergency response situations. It is my mission to continue the fine work the Township's residents have received in the past, and to improve and update our area whenever possible.

I have had the pleasure of meeting with many of you at various Homeowner's Association meetings in person and on zoom or social media, and I look forward to meeting many more. Thank You for Supporting Our Recycling Program

STARTS 4/10/23 ENDS 11/3/2023 • Mon - Fri • 7AM - 3PM

Please pull up to the north end of the garage building at 237 Melvin Dr. Northbrook, ring the bell and we will help you take the recyclable material out of your car.



The Northfield Township Road District will share with residents and businesses the cost of approximately 25 new parkway trees in 2023. Trees will range between 3 and 3 1/2" inches in diameter and a property owner's share will be \$300 per tree ordered, regardless of variety or size. There is a limit of two trees per property, providing there is adequate room within the public right-of-way. (Sorry, no trees may be ordered for private property.) The trees will be planted during May, June and if necessary, early October as weather permits. There is a 15-month one-time replacement guarantee for each tree. Guarantees do not cover tree death due to obvious owner neglect, including over or under watering. The Northfield Township Road District will provide property owners with tree-care instructions. Trees must be planted equidistant from curb and sidewalks, at least 35' from any other parkway tree, at least 10' from a driveway or street light and at least 45' from an intersection to ensure unobstructed sight lines. Locations must be at least 5' from manholes, fire hydrants and b-boxes.

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Indicate the number and type of 3-3 1/2" diameter trees (limit of two at \$300 each) on Tree Guide (right).
 - No trees are available for planting on private property.
 - Should your first choice be unavailable by the time your application is processed, Northfield Township Road District staff will call you to select an alternative.
2. Orders must be submitted on this form by May 1, 2023, and will be processed in the order received. Northfield Township Road District funds and tree quantities are limited, so **PLEASE ORDER EARLY!**
3. Draw a simple sketch of your property in the box below. Indicate pertinent landmarks such as building, driveway, utility structures, etc. Place an X at the location where you want your tree planted, and place an arrow indicating North. Residents may suggest locations, but Northfield Township Road District personnel will make final decisions to ensure uniformity with utility system and sight-line guidelines.

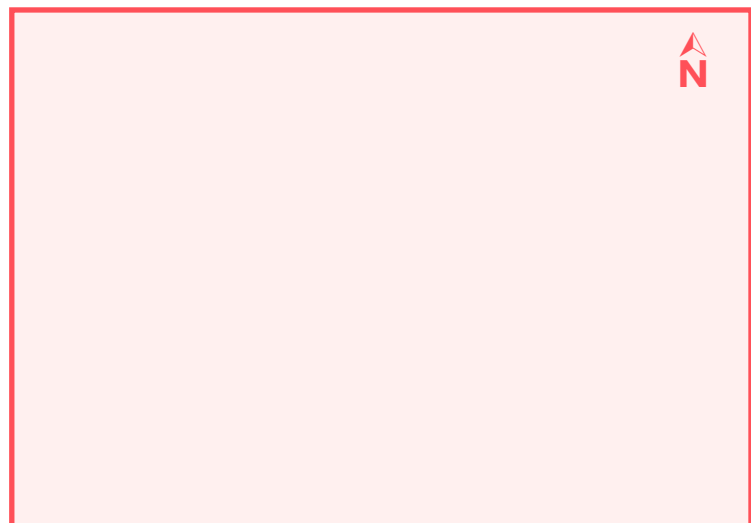

- FREEMAN MAPLE**
 Crown: Moderately oval Height: 50' Width: 30'
 Growth Rate: Medium Size: Large
 Summer Foliage: Light green to green
 Fall Foliage: Red
 Fruit: Seedless

- SWAMP WHITE OAK**— (Our favorite indigenous oak)
 Crown: Oval Height: 60' Width: 50'
 Growth Rate: Moderate to fast Size: Large
 Summer Foliage: Emerging purplish green changing to dark green
 Fall Foliage: Golden yellow brown
 Fruit: Acorn with long stem

- TRIUMPH ELM**— (Resistant to Dutch elm Disease)
 Crown: Upright symmetrical Height: 55' Width: 45'
 Growth Rate: Medium Size: Large
 Summer Foliage: Dark green
 Fall Foliage: Yellow
 Fruit: None

- ORNAMENTAL PEAR**
 Crown: Moderately pyramidal Height: 35' Width: 25'
 Growth Rate: Moderate Size: Medium
 Summer Foliage: Dark green
 Fall Foliage: Red purple (persisting to early winter)
 Fruit: White spring flowers, pea-sized fruit





2022 BRUSH PICK-UP SERVICE

Northfield Township – Unincorporated Areas Only

In our continued effort to provide this service to residents of unincorporated Northfield Township, free brush pick-up will happen during the months of May, June, and September. Please follow the pick-up times and requirements below so that we may have a safe and expedient brush pick-up.

PICK-UP TIMES:

Brush bundles should be placed at the roadway edges by May 2nd, June 6th and September 6th if you live south of Willow Road and by May 16th, June 20th and September 19th if you live north of Willow Road.

MONTH OF MAY

South of Willow Road: Brush pick-up will begin at 7:30 a.m. on Monday May 2nd.

North of Willow Road: Brush pick-up will begin at 7:30 a.m. on Monday, May 16th.

MONTH OF JUNE

South of Willow Road: Brush pick-up will begin at 7:30 a.m. on Monday, June 6th.

North of Willow Road: Brush pick-up will begin at 7:30 a.m. on Monday, June 20th.

MONTH OF SEPTEMBER

South of Willow Road: Brush pick-up will begin at 7:30 a.m. on Tuesday, September 6th.

North of Willow Road: Brush pick-up will begin at 7:30 a.m. on Monday, September 19th.

REMEMBER, ONCE WE HAVE GONE THROUGH AN AREA, WE WILL NOT RETURN UNTIL THE NEXT SCHEDULED DATE.

- PLACE CUT ENDS TOWARD THE ROADWAY. CREWS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO PICK UP MATERIAL ON PRIVATE PROPERTY.
- Brush bundles 4 feet or shorter must be tied with no more than 4 feet of twine at the largest part of the bundle. These brush bundles should be no larger than 16 inches in diameter. WIRE MUST NOT BE USED since it is dangerous and harmful to crew and equipment.
- Brush bundles must be free of stumps, root balls, dirt and stones, metal, construction material and other trash. Nothing in garbage cans, boxes, bags, or any other container will be picked up.
- Branches should be no larger than 16 inches in diameter. These branches do not have to be cut into smaller bundles. Place these branches in a long, low pile.
- Any tree, bush, or plant that has thorns must be tied separate from the other brush. Follow the instructions given in the second requirement for procedures in securing this brush. Please leave this brush to the side of all other brush.

WHY PRUNE?

While pruning does enhance the appearance and value of your landscape, its importance is more than cosmetic.

- Proper pruning is essential to the health of ornamental and shade trees.
- Proper pruning can be used to train growth patterns of young trees.
- Proper pruning removes weak, dead, storm damaged or interfering branches.
- Proper pruning minimizes the risk of storm damage.
- And proper pruning provides clearance for streets, sidewalks, driveways, structures, and overhead lines. More than a “haircut” for your trees and shrubs – pruning is a way to help them live longer, healthier lives.

PARKWAY TREE TRIMMING

The Road District will continue to trim parkway trees on rights-of-way at various locations. Work has begun and should go on thru April. Tree trimming is performed on five-year cycles to maintain form and to remove dead, diseased, unattractive and low branching limbs, which are possible hazards to pedestrians, cyclists, and all forms of vehicular traffic. Our goal is to remove lower branches to a minimum height of 14 feet in order to diminish these prospective hazards.
